Different Markets

- AEA job market the big one. Academic, non-academic, international.
 Expect many academic interviews to be January 2-4 (ASSA meeting starts 1/5/23). AEA continues encouraging virtual first-round interviews.
- AAEA job market some interviews conducted at annual meeting in late July/early August, but most do interviews in conjunction with ASSA meeting. Academic and non-academic jobs in applied economics, particularly ag/resource/environmental.
- European market academic and research jobs, all virtual again (December interviews?)
- China market academic jobs, mid-December usually (not happening this year)

Timing of Events for AEA job market

 Before the start of (or early) Fall semester → decide if you will enter the job market

 August – September → get your job market packet together and make a nice, professional webpage



Timing of Events for AEA job market

- September December → (1) send out your job market packet (2) increase your visibility to potential employers (3) practice for potential interviews (4) practice giving a job talk (5) continue working on your dissertation
- Mid-November → AEA signaling



Timing of Events for AEA job market

January → Job interviews

January – March → On campus/site interviews

March → Scramble

February to June

 Applied Econ market and more non-academic interviews



Elements of a Packet

- Cover letter—how are you great for this job?
- CV
- 3 Reference letters (sometimes 4; one focused on teaching); ask for letters right away and let them know when first applications are due!
- Transcripts
- Short summary of dissertation papers
- Job market paper
- Research statement
- Teaching statement (and evidence of teaching effectiveness)
- DEAI statement



Review of packet materials

- I am willing to review and give feedback on:
 - Your CV
 - A sample cover letter
 - Research statement
 - Teaching statement
- These must be submitted to me by 9/30 (to give me time to provide feedback)



Where should I send my packet?

- Note: make sure to send packet elements to your committee/letter writers so they can use those in writing your letter!
- Anywhere you would be a good fit → Target most of your applications to departments/institutions similarly ranked as SES and below
 - See: https://ideas.repec.org/top/ and http://econphd.econwiki.com/rankings.htm
- Do not be too picky early in the process



Increasing Visibility

- Create a custom profile on JOE: https://www.aeaweb.org/joe/cand.php
 - → Employers can search through the profiles
 - → Applications may be done through JOE for some positions
- What are your fields and sub-fields? What is your niche?



Increasing Visibility

 Complete your online webpage and make sure you are on the SES job market list (ask Tom Dahl for help)

 Upload your job market paper to REPEC: <u>http://ideas.repec.org/jmp.html</u>

• Use econ twitter?



Important dates

- Right away talk to letter writers if you haven't already
- Sept 30 send me selected packet materials for review
- October-December (and beyond) submit applications
- November job market meeting for those entering the job market (discussion of interview tips)
- November send signals to employers you are especially interested in (through AEA portal)
- Early December series of mock interviews with faculty



Where you can go to for help

Main advisor – primary guide through out the whole process

 Me – help to increase your visibility; give tips; give comments on presentation; preparation for the interview

 The department (Jaimie) – help get reference letters together



Things to do

- Be sure you are actually entering the job market (talk to your advisor)
- Create profile in JOE and make a list of places to apply
- Find letter writers and keep them up-to-date!
- Submit profile to me along with three institutions
- Update SES webpage
- Send packet and check JOE and other webpages regularly



Things to ask/discuss with advisor

- Where to focus applications
- How to "sell" your work
- Does (s)he have any connections at places you are applying?
- Keep her up-to-date on applications submitted (other letter writers as well)
