



## **Beyond the Ribbon: Unleashing the Hidden Benefits of Competition**

Most of us have experienced the joy and excitement of winning a ribbon or trophy at some sort of competition. Whether it was at a track meet, a photography contest, a horse show, or an award at work or school, winning usually just feels good. Many of us have also felt the disappointment of not earning that ribbon or trophy we so desperately wanted. Oftentimes, we are so focused on winning that we forget about all the other great things we learn from competing. With the county and state fairs coming up, now is a great time to discuss some of the other (more important) benefits of competition beyond the ribbons and trophies.

### **Learning and Mastering a Skill**

Competitions are excellent opportunities to learn or master a skill. For a 4-H member participating in the county fair, this might mean perfecting your baking skills to present the best pie, improving your livestock grooming techniques, or enhancing your photography to capture that perfect shot. These skills honed during competitions can benefit you for the rest of your life.

### **Goal setting and Achievement**

Competitions teach you to work towards a goal, an essential life skill. Setting and achieving goals in a competitive environment can help you develop discipline, persistence, and a sense of accomplishment. For example, setting a goal to raise and show a healthy, well-groomed animal at the fair requires careful planning, dedication, and hard work. These goal-setting habits can translate into effective goal setting in your personal and professional life.

### **Teamwork and Collaboration**

Many competitions are team-based, and learning to function as a team is crucial. Teamwork is a skill you will use throughout your life—in relationships, at work, and in your hobbies. For example, participating in a group project at the fair, such as a group gardening exhibit or a team demonstration, teaches you how to communicate effectively, trust your teammates, and work together towards a common goal. Even working with your livestock in a competition can enhance your understanding of non-verbal communication and partnership.

### **Having Fun and Reducing Stress**

Competitions can be fun and serve as a great way to relax and release stress. They provide opportunities to meet new people, try new things, and enjoy the thrill of the challenge. Engaging in a fun competition, like entering a homemade ice cream contest at the fair, can provide a much-needed break from daily routines and help you build lasting friendships.

### **Learning Sportsmanship**

Learning to be a good sport, whether winning or losing, can go a long way. Good sportsmanship teaches you to congratulate others, appreciate their hard work, and maintain a positive attitude. This skill is invaluable in creating a supportive and encouraging environment, both in competitions and in everyday life. For example, acknowledging a fellow competitor's success in the showmanship category can foster mutual respect and lifelong friendships.

## Life Skills Development


Competitions teach you numerous life skills that extend beyond the immediate context. Below is the Targeting Life Skills Model that 4-H uses, showing how life skills are related to the 4 H's (Head, Heart, Hands, and Health). Beyond the skills mentioned above, competitions can teach you public speaking, record-keeping, responsibility, practice, and problem-solving. These experiences will be more valuable in the long run than the ribbons, trophies, and certificates that may gather dust in your closet. For example, the public speaking skills learned while presenting your project at the fair can help you excel in job interviews and professional presentations.

At the end of the day, the life skills and experiences gained from competing are what truly matter. These skills can help you get into college, land an amazing job, or earn a promotion. So next time you are competing, try to remember all the other great things you gain from competing other than ribbons!

## Embrace the Journey

Remember, the journey of competition is filled with invaluable lessons and experiences. Embrace the process, cherish the growth, and celebrate every step of the way. The ribbons and trophies are just the cherry on top of the incredible skills and memories you gain from the adventure. Happy competing!

# **Camperville Rules and Regulations:**

To ensure a positive and safe campground experience, any camper found violating a regulation may be subject to dismissal from the campground and loss of campground privileges in future years. The campground is intended to accommodate fair participants and patrons during the KC fair each year. By using the areas for recreation vehicle parking/camping you agree to the following rules:

1. Camperville Host has authority to assign spaces and enforce these rules.
2. You are responsible for your guests, their children and pets. Your use of the area may be immediately revoked if any rules are violated under your watch by any guests.
3. Each camper must check in upon arrival. Check out is strict at NOON July 15th, 2024
4. Maximum 1 sleeping unit per site.
5. Camping allowed in established campsites only. All sites are 20'x40'.
6. One vehicle is allowed per site and must display parking pass.
7. Maximum 8 people per site.
8. All Pets, other than service animals or show animals are not allowed on fairground property during our event. All dogs must be kept inside your recreational vehicle. Pets must be on a leash no longer than eight (8) feet. Continuous barking, aggressive behavior or failure to comply with the above rules will result in the immediate revoke of your camp space and you will be held responsible for any damages.
9. NO open fires, wood fire pits, charcoal grills, and fireworks. Only self contained gas grills or fire pits are allowed.
10. Quiet hours are 10:30pm to 6:00am.
11. You assume all risks of loss, damage to, or destruction of your vehicle(s) and other property as the KC Fair does not provide security at the recreational vehicle and camping areas. Including, but not limited to, the loss/damage to property from fire, explosion, theft, vandalism, the elements, collision, or acts of omission by the Fair, their employees, agent and volunteers; or resulting from any other cause. You waive all claims of subrogation by your insurance companies. You agree to indemnify, defend and hold the city and the KC Fair, their appointed officials, employees, agents and volunteers, harmless from and against any and all claims, damages, losses and expenses for any bodily injury, sickness, disease, death, or any damage to/ destruction of property. Including the loss of use from which are caused in whole or in part by your act of omission or caused by the use of condition of your vehicle(s).
12. As a courtesy to others, please refrain from running your generator nonstop.
13. Alcoholic beverages must maintain in campsite. No outside alcohol is allowed inside the grounds.
14. Your camp space must be kept neat and clean. Garbage and litter will not be tolerated or accumulated in camp space. Please place trash in the provided garbage receptacles.

**A few reminders**

- 1) Small animal load-in only until 4:00PM (this does not include 4-H or FFA Rabbits)
- 2) Large animal scale will not open until 4:00PM. See the above load-in schedule based on animal species.
- 3) No animal will be allowed thru gate 1 without a signed vet check stall/cage card. You will be asked to return to parking lot with out one.
- 4) QUICKLY unload after weigh-ins and park vehicle outside the grounds in parking lot. You may return thru gate 1 as a walk-
