along the street.
Watch for
pedestrians.

from above or use a
sloped, bark-chipped
path to reach the
water's edge. Path is
not ADA accessible.

No restroom
This site is a great
spot to view recent
restoration efforts
and components of
healthy fish habitat.

**Talk with salmon docents at

stream bugs. Learn about
invasive crabs and how to
identify them in our waters.**

 **3 min walk from –**
Kitsap Transit Line #212
Stop: Ridgetop at Blaine

There is plenty of
parking available
near a wheelchair
accessible
observation deck.

The observation
deck and gravel trail
are ADA accessible.
There is a mild slope
down to a fairly flat
site. Directional signs
will be at the street
and trailhead.

No restroom
Mature Douglas-fir,
western red-cedar
and Sitka spruce
shade the creek.
Informational signs:
salmon life cycle,
birds/bugs of Clear
Creek.

**Talk with salmon docents on
a small viewing platform.
Learning activities with KRL
librarians. Salmon anatomy
with a fish biologist.
Entomologist-led look at
stream bugs.**

Stop: Viking at Edvard

Two parking lots at
Lindvig Way and
Bond Rd., as well as
Nelson Park with
access to Fish Park
via a trail under the
Lindvig Way Bridge.
Enjoy the colorful
murals.

The path to most of
the viewing areas is
ADA accessible with
a combination of
boardwalk and
packed gravel trail.
There will be
directional signage.

Restroom
A platform offers a
new salmon viewing
site. Enjoy a natural
surface climbing
structure, boardwalk
trails and
interpretive signage.

Porta Potty on site
View outdoor working
salmon enrichment
operations vs. natural
stream. This center
works to build stocks
while wild populations
recover.

**View native salmon and see
two salmon dissections
occurring during the day.
Learning activities with KRL
librarians. Create a salmon
journal and more.
Microscopes and guidebooks
available for use.**
