Pressure Canner Lid/Gauge Testing!

Canner gauges wear out over time and *can cause a safety hazard* if they aren't registering the correct pressure! Gauges should be checked annually.

Tractors

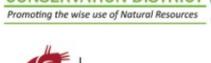
