



WSU Jefferson County Extension Master Gardener Volunteer Training 2025/26

Thank you for your interest in becoming a Master Gardener volunteer! The WSU Extension Master Gardener Program is open to individuals interested in becoming volunteers and sharing gardening and other horticulture knowledge with the general public through community outreach. Extension Master Gardener volunteers engage with communities to support stewardship of our soil, water and wildlife, and contribute to food security by using sustainable gardening practices.

Training:

Becoming a Master Gardener volunteer begins with an intensive, fast-paced training spanning October 7th, 2026, through February 15th, 2027 – 19 weeks in duration (includes breaks for holidays and catch-up time). Training combines online modules accessed through WSU's Green School and Jefferson County EMG in-person workshops, fields trips and volunteer training.

Major topics include:

Topoic

Online course:

Participants engage with weekly online learning modules, including Zoom sessions, a 29-chapter manual, corresponding quizzes, and a final exam (all open book). Feedback from past participants indicate weekly modules took between 3 and 6 hours. Passing score for quizzes and the final exam must be an average of 80% or higher.

In-person classes/workshops/field trips

In-person classes meet on Mondays from 2:00pm to 5:00pm; October 12, 19 and 26; November 2, 9, 16 and 30; December 7 and 14; and January 4 (make-up day, if needed), 11 and 18. Applicants need to commit to attending at least 80% of the in-person classes. Please consult with the Program Coordinator to discuss potential conflicts.

Computer access:

Participants need computer experience and feel comfortable navigating the internet and using email. Participants will need access to a computer for extended periods.

Volunteer Commitment:

Upon successful completion of training, volunteers begin a one-year internship during which they serve at least **50** volunteer hours on projects such as the "Ask a Master Gardener" clinic, tabling at community events, supporting or providing youth and adult education - to name just a few of the many volunteer opportunities.

After the internship year, MGs can retain certified status by serving at least 25 volunteer hours each year, plus an additional 10h of continuing education.

If the volunteer commitment is not right for you, Washington Green School may be a good option. See the information about [Washington Green School training](#).

Costs & Fees:

The total cost of MG volunteer training is \$291. This includes \$275 for the course and \$16 for the required background check.

Application Instructions

Applications are now available and will continue to be received until the applicant pool is full.

Step 1: Complete the application and email (scan; no photos), mail, or drop-off to the address below. Once we receive your application, you will be invited to schedule a meeting with the program coordinator this summer.

Step 2: Meet with the program coordinator to learn more about the class, volunteer programs, as well as a chance for us to learn more about you. This meeting is informal, relaxed, and conversational. There are no trick questions!

Step 3: Register for training. Following your meeting, you will receive notification of acceptance to the program. Included in your acceptance, you will find information about how to complete registration for the class as well as how to complete your background check.

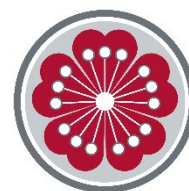
