Karen Johnson Solo Scholarship Opportunity

The Ninety-Nines and EAA will award a \$3,000 Karen Johnson Solo Scholarship to provide a young woman (age 16-20 at any time during 2015 calendar year) with financial support for flight training through her first solo and beyond. The application should include the name, address, email, cell phone, birthdate of the applicant along with a 500-word essay describing why the candidate wants to learn to fly, how she will apply her training, and her goals for the future. Applications must be submitted by email by **July 7, 2015** to KJSoloScholarship@ninety-nines.org. The scholarship will be awarded during the WomenVenture activities at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh on **Wednesday, July 22**. The winner will be expected to provide a 400-1000 word essay to the scholarship committee at KJSoloScholarship@ninety-nines.org after her solo, sharing her training experiences and goals she has met.
