

International Hosting Opportunity (not affiliated with 4-H)

No youth at home required! Greenheart Exchange, a non-profit student exchange organization, is seeking hosts for Japanese exchange students for 1 - 3 weeks starting July 25. During the program the teen students have activities most weekdays, so the program is suitable for busy, working families. (Family members may also join on activities, if they wish). \$50/week per student is provided to offset expenses related to hosting. We welcome hosts with and without children, single parents, and empty nesters. Hosts provide a bed (student may share a room with similarly aged host sibling), meals, and a warm and safe environment. The students come with spending money and insurance. A local American coordinator provides ongoing support to the student and host family. A few short weeks can lead to lifetime friendships!
