I'd like you to think about your favorite teacher. What about them stands out? If I could hear your answers, I bet I would hear two things that all your favorite teachers have in common: you know that they really care about you – and, they make learning fun! This week's challenge is all about making learning fun! By using a little imagination, you can open a whole new world of fun as you meet this week's challenge and create a game of your own!

## official challenge instructions . . .



**Step 1) Find a game you have at home.** Any game you like to play will work! It could be a board game, cards, letter tiles, memory cards, a trivia game, or ??

**Step 2) Pick a subject you want to learn more about.** Maybe it's something you need to learn for school, or something you want to explore just for fun, like another part of the world, or a new project in 4-H! Whatever it is, find a book, or a website, (or maybe

even a person), where you can find information on your subject.

**Step 3) Now get creative and modify the game to create your own!** The sky's the limit here! Think about how you can use the parts of your game to create a new one to help you learn about your subject! You could replace game cards with questions. If you want to learn new vocabulary or practice spelling, you could use letter tiles to spell out words, or arrange them into a crossword puzzle. If you don't have a board game, you could make your own memory matching cards, or a Bingo game!
