Enclosed are registration forms for the 2019 State Hippology Contest

- Contest will be held on **Saturday, April 13, 2019**
- Contest location is Snohomish, WA at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, 5511 64th St SE, Snohomish, WA 98290. This is the same venue as last year. The judging phase will be held at a nearby arena.
- Teams will need to provide their own transportation to and from the judging; plan accordingly.
- Registration will open at 8:00 a.m. at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. Contest announcements will begin at 8:45 a.m.; and the contest itself will begin promptly at 9:00 a.m.
- We will not formally break for lunch and there is no food on site for purchase. Teams are encouraged to bring their lunch with them and will be allowed to eat throughout the day.
- A list of local hotels is attached for those traveling from other parts of the state.
- The contest fee is \$20.00 per individual. Both registration and fees are due **April 1, 2019**. Payment is to be made out to the **Washington State 4-H Advisory Board** and mailed to: Kim Lobb, c/o WSU 4-H Extension, 600 128th Street SE, Everett, WA 98208
- Counties are limited to four senior and four intermediate 4-H individual youth contestants. Counties may combine up to four individuals at each level to form a team.
- **IMPORTANT: AGE RESTRICTION RULE AT NATIONALS.** Our state and the Eastern National contest have different age restrictions. For Senior Teams: contestants must be at least 14 years of age, but not have reached his or her 19th birthday as of January 1 of the year in which this event is held. <http://www.4hroundup.com/Rules>
