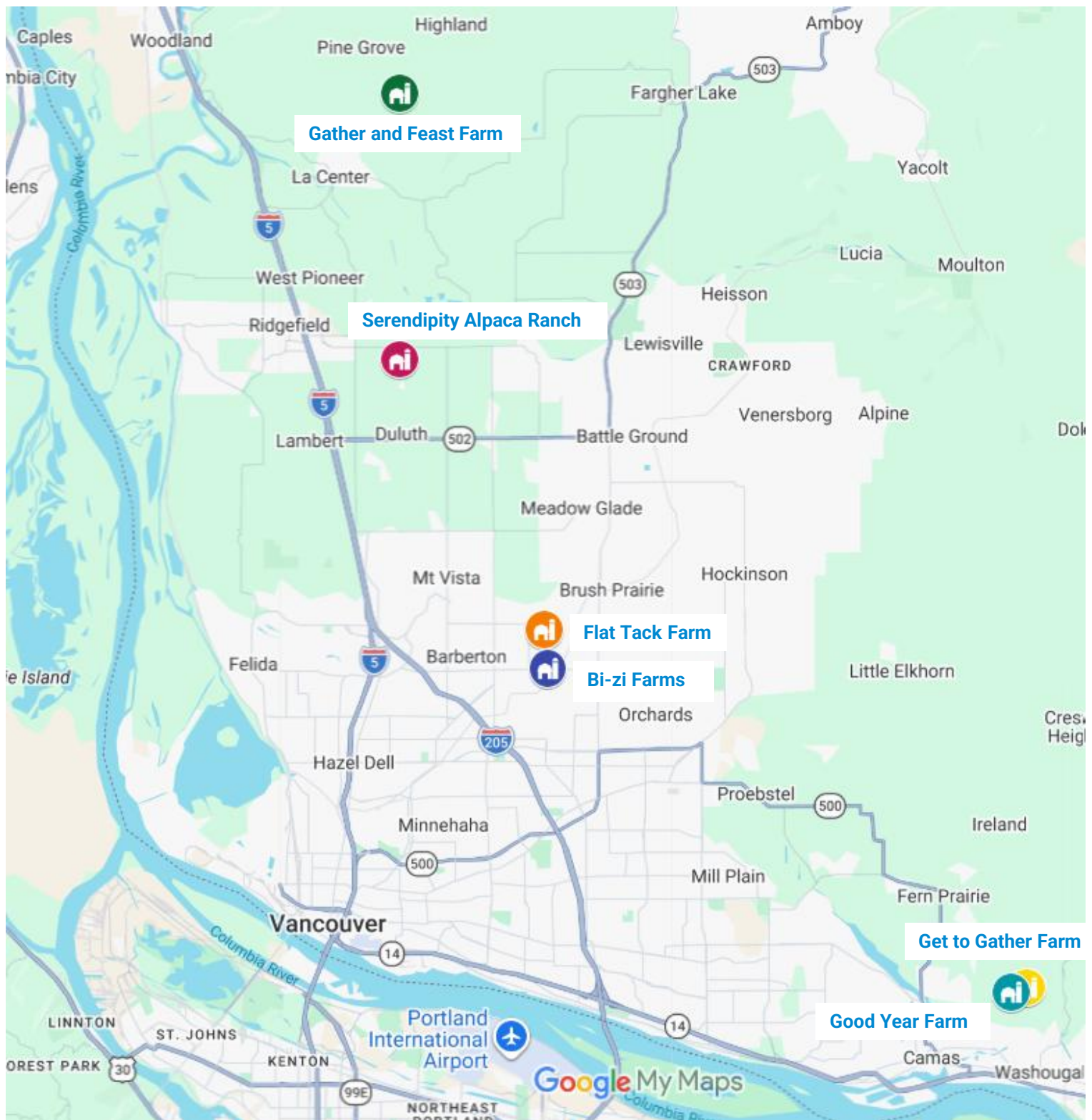

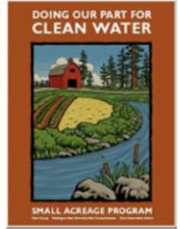

Pumpkin Patch – 2.5 acres with a wide assortment of carvers and ornamental pumpkins! Pick your favorite!

Hayrides – Every ½ hour with two wagons rollin'. The small one is ADA accessible for those in wheelchairs or with mobility difficulties!

Farm Stand – open Weds-Sun, 9AM-Dark. It's almost a small grocery store with local produce and shelf-stable yummys of all sorts!

Apple Cider Demo – at 11:00, and 1:00

Chickens, Geese, Ducks, Rabbits, Goats – We have 120 chickens, 14 geese, 15 ducks, 2 rabbits and 2 goats to get to know! Walk through the orchard where the chickens and geese free-range and feed them some snacks.

Zen Garden and Nature Trails – Check out our woody trails and meditate for a moment!

Kids' Activities – Hay Bale Pyramid, giant Teeter-Totter, kids' maze (solve the riddle!), feed the chickens, and run them until they're tired out!

You-Pick Flowers – Dahlias and sunflowers – so beautiful!

Farm trails – Go for a walk and enjoy some of the best scenery around!

Farmer's Market – We have a bunch of outside vendors joining us with food, crafts and activities!

Family-Friendly – Open daily from 9am-dark; please keep your dog on a leash!

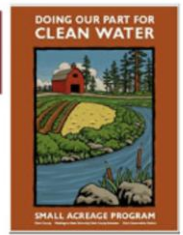

Latitude 45.72026, Longitude -122.57707. <https://www.flat-tack-farm.com/> Veggies, cider pressing demo, make your own dried flower bouquet, and feed farm hens and neighbor pigs and goats. We started Flat Tack Farm in 2017 with a simple goal: to grow real, nutrient-dense food without harmful chemicals, the way nature intended. Through regenerative practices and a deep respect for the land, we're building a thriving, sustainable farm—and we invite you to be part of it! Along with our farmstand and CSA in the spring and summer months, we also provide our fresh produce to local restaurants, grocery stores, and farmers market vendors. Farm Stand open every Thursday 3-6pm. Handicapped accessible parking and port-a-potties available.

Also, come get your pumpkins! Come enjoy meeting sheep, goats, cows, llamas, ducks, and pigs at our petting zoo. There is also a farm store with a wide variety of produce, including tomatoes, hot peppers, cucumbers, potatoes, onions, pumpkins, apples, and pears. Restrooms (handicapped accessible porta johns) are available.
