

# Common errors and what they mean

Errors	What it means & What to do next
<p>You are trying to enroll in a course on another campus that is not your home campus. Alternatively, you are an undergraduate trying to enroll in a graduate class.</p>	<p>This means that you have selected a class that is not on the Pullman Campus. Remove the class from your shopping cart and search for a Pullman Campus section of the class instead. Then, add it to your shopping chart.</p>
<p>You are unable to enroll in this class at this time. Available seats are reserved, and you do not meet the reserve capacity requirements.</p>	<p>This means that a portion of seats in this class have been reserved for a specific group of students, of which you are not a part. This does not mean that you may not enroll, but instead, will have to wait until a later date to be enrolled from the waitlist.</p> <p>If you get this error, you should:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Put yourself on the waitlist.</li> <li>2) Sign up for an alternative course from your academic plan.</li> <li>3) Departments typically don't review reserve capacity classes until later in the term.</li> <li>4) If there are seats available later, students will be added based off the order they are on the waitlist.</li> <li>5) After you are added, drop your back-up class you signed up for.</li> </ol> <p>To check if a course has a reserve capacity, you can review the class notes associated with each section in the <a href="#">schedule of classes</a>.</p>
<p>Requisites not met.</p>	<p>This means that you do not meet one or more of the pre- or co-requisites for the course. To locate the pre- and corequisites for a course, you can view the course, description, and prerequisites on the <a href="#">schedule of classes</a> by clicking the section number under the course you'd like to take.</p> <p>If you are attempting to enroll in a course at the same time as a corequisite, enroll in the corequisite course first. For example, you must be enrolled in B_A 204 before you enroll in B_A 205, B_A 206 and MGTOP 215.</p> <p>Please note if you are waitlisted for a course and attempting to enroll in an associated corequisite course, you are not considered enrolled and would receive this error. In this situation, you would need to enroll in another section that does not have a waitlist OR wait until you are enrolled in the waitlisted course to enroll the course(s) requiring the corequisite.</p> <p>If you believe you meet all prerequisites for the course, email your advisor or attend drop-in advising for assistance as your next steps may vary depending upon the class.</p>
<p>Department Consent Required. You must obtain permission to take this class.</p>	<p>This means that students must be given permission to enroll in a course by the offering department. Email your advisor or attend drop-in advising for assistance as your next steps may vary depending upon the class.</p> <p>If you receive this error for ENGLISH 402, some sections of this course have been set-aside for students of a particular major.
