Political Bubbles & Financial Crises



Professor Rosenthal will discuss "political bubbles" – policy biases that foster market behaviors that lead to financial instability. Demonstrating how political bubbles helped create the real estate-generated financial bubble and the 2008 financial crisis, Professor Rosenthal argues that similar government oversights in the aftermath of the crisis undermined Washington's response to the "popped" financial bubble, and shows how such patterns have occurred repeatedly throughout US history.

Howard Rosenthal is professor of politics at New York University and the Roger Williams Straus Professor of Social Sciences, Emeritus, at Princeton University.
