**Courses required for the waiver endorsement option: SPEC_ED 301, 401, 402, 404, 421 and at least 2 credits in SPEC_ED 490 for on-campus students/completion of SPEC_ED 499 for online students.

***SPEC_ED 490 Practicum must be taken two (2) credits at a time. You must complete 45 hours PER CREDIT, for a total of 90 hours per semester. You will complete 180 hours total in your two semesters of practicum. These two credit blocks can be taken in fall, spring, or Maymester.

Note: Endorsements designate the subject matter an individual is authorized to teach. The above requirements are for the teaching endorsement only and do not necessarily fulfill the requirements for a major/minor. The student is responsible for all course prerequisites and for satisfying departmental requirements for graduation.
