Biography of Artists

Jose Iniguez

José Iñiguez, a tenor and award-winning Latin music artist, was born in Mattawa, Washington, to Mexican immigrant parents. Despite humble beginnings, he found solace in traditional Mexican music and began singing at family events at age 12. His passion for opera was ignited by a PBS performance, leading him to study music in college at CWU under Professor Sydney Knesselroad and Munich Opera singer Jerry Halsey. José is known for blending opera and mariachi bolero, earning recognition such as Univision Seattle's Latin Music Artist Award and Seattle Magazine's 25 Most Influential People in the Puget Sound in 2024. As Executive Director of Encanto Arts and a Teaching Artist for Seattle Opera, he supports over 500 artists annually and promotes higher education through four family scholarship endowments.

Mareanne Silva

Marianne, born in Torrance, California and raised in Colima, Mexico, is a self-taught singer with a deep passion for mariachi music. Over the years, she honed her talent with the support of her mother and the guidance of vocal teachers like Mario Cortes and Juanpablo Alvear. Marianne's career has flourished through her performances with mariachi groups and orchestras, earning her recognition as a national ambassador of mariachi and charrería in 2018. With a commitment to promoting mariachi music, Marianne continues to perform on prestigious stages across Mexico and the U.S., showcasing her unique voice and dedication to the genre.
