



WSU 4-H Youth Development Thurston County 4-H 2025-26 Club List

Thank you for your interest in Thurston County 4-H! The new 4-H year starts October 1. (The 4-H year runs October 1 – September 30.) Joining 4-H early in the year offers more 4-H club choices as clubs can fill to capacity quickly.

Please follow these steps to join a Thurston County 4-H Club:

1. **Check 4-H age eligibility.** Thurston County 4-H is open to all youth who have reached their 5th birthday on or before October 1st of the current 4-H year through those who have not reached their 19th birthday on or before October 1st of the current 4-H year.
*Please review the details about 4-H Cloverbud age youth if you have a child aged 5 to 7.
**Please review the statement for Special Education youth aged 19 and older.
2. **Determine 4-H Project interests.** Most 4-H clubs in Thurston County are project-based clubs. 4-H project-based clubs focus on specific 4-H project interest areas when they gather as a club. For example, a youth wanting to care for and train a dog would join a 4-H club that offers the 4-H dog project. A **self-determined project** is one the 4-H member learns about and works on independently.
3. **Review the list of 4-H Clubs** to find a potential 4-H club to join. Look for a group that offers the 4-H project interest areas your child or children are interested in learning about. Contact the 4-H office at tc4h@co.thurston.wa.us if you would like help finding a club that best fits your school-age child's/children's interests and needs.
4. **Contact the club leader directly** to learn more about the club or clubs you are interested in joining. Each 4-H club is different, and you may find it helpful to ask questions before joining. Consider asking how often the club meets and where they meet, what 4-H projects (interest areas) they cover as a club (group learning) and which 4-H projects youth are working on independently (self-determined 4-H projects). You may also want to inquire if the club has youth members the same age as your child or children. Please note: some clubs do not offer 4-H Cloverbud age activities.
5. **AFTER** you have contacted a club leader and confirmed with the club leader your family would like to join, please officially enroll in the 4-H Club by going to 4-H Online (the online enrollment system). Use this link to access the 4-H Online Family Guidebook and video about using 4-H Online <https://extension.wsu.edu/4h/member-resources/>. 4-H youth members must be enrolled in a 4-H Club via 4-H Online (online system) **by April 15** to be eligible for Thurston County Fair 4-H entry/exhibit. Please note: the 4-H Online enrollment system is closed to new members August 1 – September 30 each year.

4-H Age Divisions:

Cloverbuds: 5 to 7 years of age

Junior: 8 to 10 years of age

Intermediate: 11 to 13 years of age

Senior: 14 to 18 years of age

4-H Age Eligibility:

Enrolled 4-H Youth Members must have reached their 8th birthday on or before October 1st of the current 4-H year to be eligible for:

- Competitive situations, including livestock shows or sales
- Enrollment in large animal projects including Beef, Dairy, Goat, Horse, Sheep, Alpaca/Llama, and Swine
- Enrollment in shooting sports projects
- Enrollment in projects using motorized vehicles
- Enrollment in food preservation projects

*Cloverbuds may participate in age-appropriate activities and projects. Projects recommended for Cloverbuds youth may include: Dog, Cat, Poultry, Rabbit, Pygmy or Novelty Goat, Horseless Horse, Cavy, Exploring the World of Small Animals, Exploring Farm Animals, Discovery, Creative Arts, Performing Arts, Aerospace, Bicycle, Computer, Photography, Clothing, Just Outside the Door, and Exploring 4-H.

Cloverbuds **may not** participate in competitive activities.

- A novelty goat is defined as a small goat that is purebred or cross-bred lineage; is up to 23 inches in height and weighs no more than 65 pounds.
- Cloverbuds should demonstrate competence in exhibiting and caring for animal projects prior to exhibiting at fairs, shows, or similar events.

**Special Education youth who have reached their 19th birthday (on or before October 1st of the current 4-H year) through those who have not reached their 22nd birthday (on or before October 1st of the current 4-H year), may enroll with the approval of the WSU Extension 4-H faculty.
