How do I borrow a tool?

- Become a member (18+ yrs old), then reserve the tools you need online.
- Pick up and return tools at **104 E. Floral St. in Centralia** on Fridays from 3-6 pm.

How do I become a member?

1. Complete a Membership Application on www.mrctoolbucketlibrary.myturn.com
2. Sign and Date the Liability Waiver and Tool Use Policy
3. Provide photo ID at *first* tool pickup

How much will it cost?

The Tool Bucket Library is FREE to join, however, it does cost money to operate even though it is ran by volunteers.

Suggested Annual Donations:

- Senior, student, low income, veteran: \$25
- General public: \$45
- Community supporter: \$150
- Lifetime: \$750

Not sure you want to join for a year?

- \$7 for a month
- \$25 for 6 months

The Tool Bucket Library is a *pay what you can* non-profit run by volunteers. **NO ONE** will be turned away because of their ability to pay.

We want to encourage pride in community and help residents live more sustainable and resilient lives.

What if I return a tool late?

All tools must be returned clean and in good working condition the following **Friday** to avoid a late fee of **\$5 a week per tool**.

Reservations may be extended for an additional week upon request unless tools are already reserved by others.

What are donations used for?

Our goal is to keep the WSU Master Recycler Composters of Lewis County (*d.b.a. MRC Tool Bucket Library*) a financially sustaining 501(c)3, non-profit organization.

We use membership and late fee donations to operate this *all-volunteer* project by buying and maintaining our tools for the community to share.

Other critical expenses include liability insurance, repair supplies, tool library software, and equipment needed for basic operations.
