**Breed Report** is mandatory for all Exhibitors that ARE NOT DOING market projects, one book per exhibitor, and will be turned in at Check-In. Breed records must include:

- Introductory Page with your full name / Level / Club / Phone #
- This Form with boxes checked with pages in this order signed by both Exhibitor and Parent.
- A Copy of the Pre-Fair Schedule
- A Breed Report form for one of exhibitor's projects
- Seniors and Intermediates may do a 2 1/2 - 5-minute informative video presentation on any facet of their project animal(s) (submitted in DVD format – capable of play on any DVD player)

Submit a 500 Word Essay "Describe the impact Covid 19 has made on your breed project. "
- Juniors will submit a 250-word essay in which you "Describe the impacts Covid 19 has made on your breed project. "
- A copy of the Livestock Rules signed by both Exhibitor and Parent.



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# 2021 SKAMANIA LIVESTOCK EXHIBIT RULES

1. Camping Haul in is allowed on the following days.
  - Superintendents, Fair Board Members and Assistants, as approved, may bring and set up their camping area beginning on Thursday prior to Fair.
  - Exhibitors and their families may bring and set up camping area beginning on Sunday prior to Fair and must haul trailers out by the end of day Monday following Fair.
2. Animal Haul in will be as follows:
  - Swine from 9am -1pm on Monday prior to Fair.
  - Small Animals from 9am-6pm on Monday prior to Fair
  - All other species-2pm -6pm on Monday prior to Fair
  - All Exhibitors must check in at the Vet Station with their Mandatory Record Book prior to unloading animals.
3. Any violation of the National Show Ring Code of Ethics or other rules will result in immediate disqualification as well as loss of standing, awards and premiums, and a one-year suspension from fair activities. A second violation will result in permanent exclusion from Skamania County Fair.
4. All decisions of the livestock Barn Managers/Superintendents are final and binding. Failure to follow these decisions will result in expulsion from the barn.
5. Judges' decisions are final. Accosting the judge in any way will result in loss of premiums and placing of the exhibitor, whether committed by exhibitor or other person in exhibitor's stead.
6. Project reports are mandatory for all exhibitors except Primaries/Cloverbuds
7. All exhibitors, excluding cloverbuds/primaries, must do a new poster, each year and turn it in on Saturday prior to fair, which will be the only designated decoration/dusting/cleanup day. Posters will be judged and those receiving a blue ribbon will be eligible for state fair.
8. Maximum Project Animals allowed per exhibitor:
  - Large livestock- Five (5) animals- combined total-in all Large Livestock Species
  - Small Animals - Ten (10) animals- combined total-in all Small Animal Species
9. Animal designations are:
  - Large Livestock: dairy cattle, beef cattle, sheep, meat goats, dairy goats, swine,
  - Small Animals: chickens, ducks, game birds, turkeys, geese, and rabbits,
  - Companion animals: novelty goats, pack goats, cavies, alpacas, llamas, dogs and cats
10. All animals must be shown except nursing infants. No pregnant animal will be allowed that is due within 30 days of fair. Once born, exception to haul-in will be made and room afforded for display only.
11. Exhibitor must accept stalls as assigned by the Superintendent.
12. All animals must receive a vet check prior to entering the barn. If at any time the Fair Vet indicates that an animal must be removed from the barn and/or fair, such will occur immediately. Failure to remove the animal will result in suspension from fair this year. Additional refusal will result in permanent exclusion from Skamania County Fair.
13. A minimum of three (3) animals per class is required to award a Class Master Showmanship buckle which is required for participation in the Round Robin.
14. Exhibitors must meet care and control requirements. Beef 120 days, Swine 90 days, other livestock 60 days.
15. Youth exhibitors wanting to leave the immediate fairgrounds must report to their leader and leave a telephone number where they can be reached. Their leader will inform the Area Superintendent.

16. Fair is closed to the public on Sunday but removal of animals and/or decorations before authorization of the livestock & Area Superintendents will result in forfeit of all premiums.
17. Grooming, handling and exercise of project animals and herdsmanship must be performed by the youth exhibitor; this includes clipping and washing the animal. In cases where youth exhibitors are physically incapable of doing their own grooming other youth members may provide needed assistance. Only youth exhibitors are allowed in stalls with the exception of superintendents or non-related leaders when approved by the area superintendent.
18. All exhibitors shall bring or drive their animals to the Scale shack, Show ring and/or Sales ring excepting primaries/cloverbuds. An exhibitor unable to bring/drive their animal will be disqualified. Beef movement may be assisted by the use of their tails. All Beef will wear a "choke chain" when moved. Swine movement may be assisted by those approved by the area superintendent using boards to block retreat or turning. At no time will swine ears be pulled by anyone assisting, or otherwise involved, to move the animal. Any abuse of an animal will result in expulsion.
19. All exhibitors must show their own animals in fitting and showing and participate in herdsmanship to receive premium and awards.
20. Emergency veterinarian service will be provided when necessary. Exhibitors will be billed for medication used. In all animal exhibits, medication can only be given with the approval of the livestock superintendent or Fair vet.
21. Portable clipping chutes provided by an exhibitor may be used in areas designated by the livestock Superintendent.
22. Large Animal Round Robin Showmanship contest will include overall Champion and Reserve Champion from beef, dairy cattle, sheep, swine, horse, meat goats, and dairy goats. Juniors may participate.
23. Small Animal Round Robin Showmanship contest will include overall Champions and Reserve Champion (see rule #13) from rabbit, waterfowl, turkeys, game birds, ducks, geese, chickens. Companion Animals (as designated in rule #9) are not included in the Small Animal Round Robin.
24. Livestock Exhibitors will only use the small dumpster next to the livestock barn for morning clean up. The large dumpster will be used by the horse barn and for dumping the small dumpster during the day. Violation of this rule will result in loss of herdsmanship points.
25. Herdsmanship in the Livestock Barn is a team effort. Each exhibitor will be assigned this duty daily. Exhibitors may be assigned to an area other than that in which they are exhibiting. All exhibitors must check on their animals every two hours.
26. Exhibitors are not allowed near the creek, pond or the skate park. Bikes, Scooters, Skateboards, etc. are not allowed anywhere on the fairgrounds including camping.
27. Showing of unaltered animals:
  - No horned livestock will be allowed at Fair.
  - Beef: Bulls under 6 months of age may be shown.
  - Swine: Boars are prohibited.
  - Sheep: Rams under six months of age may be shown.
  - Goats: Bucks are prohibited.
28. Show dress code:  
All Species -All Breeds: White shirts (no color showing through), blue or black jeans in good repair (minimal "bling"), ties are optional, clean appropriate headgear is optional. White pants in Dairy classes will not be worn at Fair.
29. Market Exhibitors will also read and sign the Market Rules.

## NATIONAL SHOW RING CODE OF ETHICS

- 1) All exhibitors must have viable proof of ownership available to prove length of time animals have been owned. The official ownership date is the date shown on the bill of sale, unless the animal was bred by the exhibitor, in which case calving or birth records must be shown. Registered breeding livestock must show the exhibitor as the sole owner of the animal on the breed association papers or certificates.
- 2) No exhibitor may show an animal that has been previously sold at an auction or sale as a market animal through another fair, livestock show, whether or not there has been an actual change of ownership. Any method used to misrepresent the age of an animal for a class in which it is shown is deceptive and considered illegal. Showing an animal for another individual by claiming ownership in order to show in a specific livestock class or event is prohibited. FALSE OWNERSHIP IS ILLEGAL.
- 3) Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at the fair or livestock show. (Individual consideration will be given in extenuating circumstances.) Adults will not be allowed to physically assist in the preparation of the animal while at the show. Verbal instructions will be allowed, but no physical assistance is permitted. Physical assistance may be rendered by other junior aged members in good standing in the 4-H and FFA programs. Any violation will result in immediate disqualification from the show.
- 4) Treating of animals internally or externally, with any irritant, counter-irritant or other substance used to artificially change the conformation or appearance of an animal for show is considered unethical, inhumane, and is prohibited. This includes but is not limited to the use of graphite, powders, hemp, artificial hair coloring, common products such as fly spray, ointment or liniment, used to the point that it is irritating, (unless required to reduce edema at the time of calving) or similar products. The use of dyes, spray paint, or other artificial coloring which result in altering an animal's true and natural appearance and/or color is prohibited. Adding false hair or hair-like material, fleece, or skin at any point, spot or area of the animal's body is illegal and will result in immediate disqualification. Any liquid or substance not considered part of an accepted and normal diet for livestock is deemed illegal and inhumane. For example, the use of alcoholic or carbonated beverages as a drench, filler, etc.
- 5) The use of tranquilizers, sedatives, or depressants which alter the physical or physiological state of the animal is illegal. Exceptions to this rule would be a licensed, certified veterinarian's treatment for a recognized disease or injury, or recommendation for tranquilizing breeding animals in heat that might compromise the safety of others. The drugs must be approved by the FDA for use in meat producing animals. All exhibitors shall advise show management of any drugs and/or medications administered to an animal that might be detected at the time of showing or at meat inspection. The name of the drug, its purpose, the person who administered the drug, time and date of administration, shall be presented to the show management prior to the showing and sale of the animal. Failure to report this information to the show management will result in severe penalty and/or disqualification. Any use of drugs or substances not approved by the FDA is strictly prohibited. All animals entered into livestock competition shall be subject to testing for foreign substances that exceed acceptable levels established by FDA, FSIS, USDA, or EPA.
- 6) Surgery, injection or insertion of foreign material under the skin and/or the flesh of an animal to change the natural contour, conformation, or appearance of an animal's body is illegal. This includes vegetable oil, silicon, or any other substance used to alter the shape of the animal. Acceptable practices of physical preparation which are allowed include clipping of hair, trimming of hooves, dehorning, or removal of ancillary teats.

- 7) The balancing of the udder by abnormal means that includes the use of a mechanical contrivance or the injection of fluid or drugs, setting the teats and/or occluding (sealing the ends with a mechanical contrivance or with the use of a chemical preparation is illegal). Treating or massaging the udder or its attachments with an irritant or counter-irritant is illegal
- 8) The use of inhumane fitting showing and/or handling practices or devices shall not be tolerated. For example, breaking of tails, striking of the animal to cause swelling or for bracing purposes, use of an electrical contrivance, or use of overly severe bits is not acceptable.
- 9) Direct criticism or interference with the judge, show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited.
- 10) At the time an animal is sold at auction at the livestock show, the exhibitor shall be held directly responsible for animals that are rejected at a processing center due to the presence of foreign residues. If for any reason, any part of a meat animal carcass must be removed by the FDA or USDA inspectors, the market price will be discounted.
- 11) Show management reserves the right to require animal health certificates. Health inspections and diagnostic tests may be made before or after animals are on the livestock show premises for exhibitor and animal safety, or in the inaugurate disease control procedures which may become necessary in emergencies as determined by animal health officials.
- 12) Any violation of "The National Show Ring Code of Ethics" or specific rules as designated by individual fairs and livestock shows will result in forfeiture of premiums and awards, disqualification, and may result in probationary status and/or loss of eligibility for future participation in organized livestock competition. Other cooperating shows will be notified of the action taken by show management, which may affect the eligibility of the individual, group or sponsoring organization for participation at other shows.
