## VIRTUAL FAIR SHOWCASE - WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

With the cancellation of the 2020 Pacific County Fair, we offer the Pacific County 4-H Virtual Fair Showcase (Fair From Home)!! This new experience will be different for all of us. We are really excited to provide a way for our youth to exhibit their projects and share what they have learned in 4-H this year.

- **Expressive Arts** entries (Record books, photography, garden, baking, posters, etc.) will be **submitted in person 8/17 – 8/18**. See the calendar on page 2 for times and places to enter. After entries are judged, they will be displayed at different locations throughout the county. Watch our Facebook page for more info.
- Ribbons will be awarded for all entries. There will be no premium points/money awarded this year. In addition, we also have some fun prizes!
- Expressive Arts interview judging will take place via Zoom. This is a great way to talk with the judge, get feedback, and have fun! You will receive a Zoom link when you enter.
- All Expressive Arts entries that receive a blue ribbon and qualify will be eligible for entry into the WA State 4-H Virtual Fair. We will take pictures and send them with an entry form for you! Full premium points/money will be awarded.
- Table setting, 4-H in Action, Shooting Sports Showmanship, Public Presentations, and My 4-H Story will take place via Zoom. You will receive a Zoom link when you enter.
- All animal shows will take place virtually. Each exhibitor will receive information on how to access their show. Large animal exhibitors will submit a showmanship video prior to their show. Remember to wear your show clothes!
- Large animal and Garden Tour videos must be submitted to Tania Remmers at [tremmers@trl.org](mailto:tremmers@trl.org) by 5:00PM on 8/20/2020.

- All shows will be limited to the exhibitor, the judge, the superintendent, and 4-H staff. It's important to keep the audience small to allow the judge to really focus on the presenter. Shows will not be open to the public.
