Log in at parking.wsu.edu and click “Order Permits”. 2. Select “Vancouver Reciprocal Permit” and select or add your vehicle, then click “Confirm”. 3. Click “Print Permit at Checkout” then click “Add Permit to Cart” 4. Verify the email is correct and click “Checkout” <p>An email will be sent to you with two attachments. Print the “Vancouver Reciprocal Permit” attachment and display it on your dashboard when you park on the Vancouver campus. Note: If you are based on the WSU Pullman campus and have a physical permit displayed (“Orange 1 All Lots”, “Orange 5 HD/MD” or “WSU”), you do not need to print or display any additional permits as outlined above.

Note: Golden Cougar permits are not part of the WSU campus reciprocal agreement and DO require a valid permit as outlined above to park on a WSU campus other than WSU Pullman.

Note: To qualify for the reciprocal agreement, faculty staff and students must possess a valid permit on their primary campus (if permits are required on their primary campus). The primary campus is the campus where the majority of university business is being conducted (3 or more business days per week).

Definitions:

Primary Campus:

WSU Campus is the campus where the majority of the university business is being conducted, 3 or more business days per week.

University Business:

Assigned duties related to your position as an employee or class requirements as a student.
