

**EXHIBIT A**  
**TERMS & CONDITIONS**

1. **Organization.** The University is entering into this Agreement for professional development training from ESD112. The provision of educational, instructional or specialized services is provided to improve student learning or achievement, offered under the authority granted in the Interlocal Cooperation Act, RCW 39.34 (specifically 39.34.030 and 39.34.080) and provisions that authorize educational service districts and the university to contract with each other for services, specifically 28A.310.010, 28A.310.180, 28A.310.200, 28A.320.080 and 28A.320.035.
2. **Financial Terms.** ESD112 shall invoice the University an amount not to exceed \$1,520.00 for workshop fees, inclusive of program travel costs, as mutually agreed, after completion of the workshop. ESD112 shall include this amount in the final invoice, to be billed after completion of the workshop.
3. **Parties' Obligations.** The Parties agree to fulfill the following obligations for delivery of workshop services under this Agreement:
  - 3.1 **Responsibilities of ESD112.** ESD112 shall:
    - 3.1.1 Teach the MIT 537-01: Problem Solving in Elementary Mathematics course, on the dates and times indicated at the identified location, subject to provisions for rescheduling due to delays beyond the control of ESD112, per Section 4 below.
    - 3.1.2 Provide course instructor for MIT 537.
    - 3.1.3 Participants will engage in mathematical problem solving and reflect upon these experiences. Instructor will develop course syllabus, plan and facilitate course time, and complete grading and evaluation in accordance with University guidelines and the intention for this course.
      - 3.1.3.1 The MIT (Master in Teaching) program schedule classes will follow the MIT-E schedule for Fall Semester including no class on Field Week, Thanksgiving Week, Finals Week. MIT courses begin 8/22/22 and do not meet the week of 11/21/22 and 12/12/22.
      - 3.1.3.2 Course will meet Thursdays from 2:10PM-4:00PM.
    - 3.1.4 Invoice the University in accordance with Section 2 above.
  - 3.2 **Responsibilities of the University.** The University shall:
    - 3.2.1 Provide facilities and access to email and Canvas for managing the course and communicating with candidates.
      - 3.2.1.1 [IF ONSITE WORK SHOP] The University shall provide space and instructional set-up for the workshop(s) that is in compliance with the most current guidelines issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Washington Department of Health, and the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) guidelines, and comply with the state proclamation orders as pertains to any infectious disease outbreaks or pandemics.
    - 3.2.2 Remit payment to ESD112 for the final invoice within thirty days of receipt for workshop fees.

- 4. Delays in Performance.** Where ESD112 is prevented from completing the workshops within the Agreement term due to delay beyond control of ESD112, the Agreement term shall be extended and the workshops rescheduled, by mutual agreement of the Parties. Delays beyond the control of ESD112 shall include, but not be limited to, acts of nature considered force majeure (Section 4.1 below), compliance orders (Section 4.2 below), or illness of the trainer.

  - 4.1 *Force Majeure.*** ESD112 and the University shall not be liable for any failure to perform its obligations in this Agreement, and shall not be liable for the damages in Section 5 below, if the failure to perform or action that gave rise to damages is a result of any act of God, riot, war, civil unrest, flood, earthquake, or other cause beyond such party's reasonable control, such as changes to federal, state or local laws, but excluding failure caused by a party's financial condition or negligence.
  - 4.2 *Compliance Orders.*** ESD112 shall deliver all services under this Agreement in compliance with the most current guidelines issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Washington Department of Health, and the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) guidelines, and comply with the state proclamations and orders as pertains to any infectious disease outbreaks or pandemics. ESD112 shall adjust delivery of services as requested and/or required to meet needs without modification to terms of the Agreement.
  
- 5. Termination.** This Agreement may be terminated by either party by providing the other party thirty (30) days written notice of intent to terminate. If the Agreement is terminated, the University shall pay ESD112 for all work performed and expenses incurred up to the date the Agreement is terminated. Fees owed following termination shall be paid within thirty (30) days of receipt of an invoice.
  
- 6. Amendments.** Changes to this Agreement by either party shall be communicated in writing to the Agreement contacts noted in Section 9 below.
  
- 7. Non-Discrimination.** Per requirements of state, local and federal laws, ESD112 and the University are prohibited from discriminating on the basis of race, color, religion (creed), national origin (ancestry), citizenship or immigration status (except as permitted by applicable laws), age, sex, gender expression or identity, sexual orientation, genetic information, honorably discharged veteran or military status, national guard or uniformed service status, marital status, family/parental status, income derived from a public assistance program or income assignment for child support, domestic violence victim status (if known), arrest and court record (except as permitted by applicable laws), political beliefs, non-job-related physical, sensory, or mental disabilities, use of a trained guide dog or service animal, credit history or credit report (unless directly related to a bona fide occupational qualification), or reprisal or retaliation for prior civil rights activity. Inquiries regarding compliance and/or grievance procedures for ESD112 may be directed to ESD112 at its address above.

8. **Exclusion, Debarment and Suspension Certification.** Per the requirements of Executive Order 12549, ESD112 and the University certify that neither they, nor their officers, directors, general managers or persons having primary management or supervisory responsibilities, are on the Excluded Parties List Report (web address: <http://www.sam.gov/SAM/>) and that they are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, or declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded for the award of contracts by any Federal governmental agency or department. ESD112 and the University shall provide immediate written notice to each other if, at any time during the term of this Agreement, including any renewals hereof, the Parties learn that this certification has become erroneous by reason of changed circumstances.
