

Pullman Campus Student Fee Guide

Mandatory Student Under Grad Fees

S&A Fee

Supports student organizations, student government, campus events, leadership programs, recreation, and services that enhance student life at WSU.

Health Fee

All students enrolled for seven or more credit hours in the fall and spring semesters and one or more in the summer are required to pay a mandatory student health and wellness fee per term. **Does NOT replace Health Insurance!**

Stadium Fee

Supports the operation, maintenance, and long-term financing of Gesa Field at Martin Stadium, helping ensure WSU students have access to a safe, modern venue for Cougar Athletics and other university events

Transit Fee

The Student Transit Program S&A Fee allocation, in conjunction with the Student Transit Fee, allows students to ride the Pullman Transit system throughout campus and the City of Pullman. Pullman Transit offers students reliable transportation options, including after dark or in inclement weather; helps make transportation easier for students with disabilities; and provides a regular mode of transportation for students without access to vehicles.

Chinook Fee

Provides eligible undergraduate students access to the Chinook Student Center and supports facility operations, maintenance, recreation and fitness spaces, study areas, esports, wellness resources, and other programs that enhance student life

CUB Fee

Supports the Compton Union Building (CUB), including student organization spaces, study areas, meeting and event rooms, student services, campus programs, and facility operations that enhance student life at WSU Pullman.

Technology Fee

Supports student technology resources across campus, including computer labs, software, equipment, technology checkout programs, and other technology improvements that enhance learning and student success.

Food Pantry Fee

Supports the Cougar Food Pantry and basic needs programs that provide free food, hygiene products, and other essential resources to WSU Pullman students experiencing food insecurity or financial hardship.

Media Fee

Helps fund student media organizations that provide news, information, and media content for the WSU community.

Optional Fees

Sports Pass

The Pullman Sports Pass is an optional fee, not a mandatory student fee. It allows eligible WSU students to attend regular-season home Cougar Athletics events throughout the academic year.

Provides access to regular-season home Cougar Athletics events, including football, basketball, baseball, volleyball, and soccer. Sports Pass holders also become members of ZZU CRU, WSU's official student fan group. More information can be found: <https://wsucougars.com/student-sports-pass>

Green Fee

An optional student contribution that supports student-led sustainability projects and environmental initiatives at WSU, including energy conservation, waste reduction, sustainable transportation, food systems, and other campus sustainability efforts. Placement & Assessment Fees

Writing Portfolio Fee

Covers the evaluation of the University Writing Portfolio, a graduation requirement that assesses students' writing skills and readiness for upper-division coursework. Math Placement Test Fee

Covers the Math Placement Assessment used to determine the appropriate math course placement, including access to online learning modules and up to four re-assessments to help students improve their placement. May not be on your

Writing Placement Fee

Covers the evaluation of the Writing Placement Assessment used to determine the most appropriate first-year writing course for incoming students. May not be on your account, depending on how student elected payment. More information can be found: <https://writingprogram.wsu.edu/uwpsubmission/>

Other Charges That May Apply

Enrollment Fee

A one-time fee paid by newly admitted students to confirm enrollment at WSU Pullman and reserve their place in an upcoming term. The fee supports the enrollment process and transition to the university. May not be on your account, depending on how student elected payment.

Course Fees

Charges associated with specific courses that help cover the cost of specialized materials, laboratory supplies, equipment, software, field experiences, or other resources required for instruction.

Late Fees

Charges assessed when tuition, fees, or other university charges are not paid by the published payment deadline. Students are responsible for monitoring their account and ensuring payments are made on time. More information and deadlines can be found: <https://catalog.wsu.edu/AcademicCalendar>
