Director of Development Senior 2 / 1511**

Function and General Scope

The Director of Development Senior 2 is responsible for developing, implementing, and administering the college's/area's development efforts to support the unit's annual fundraising operation. Responsibilities include developing methods to accomplish fundraising goals, planning and conducting public contact programs designed to promote the public's understanding of a unit's activities and research with the aim of cultivating donors and raising philanthropic gifts, and leading and directing a development team in philanthropic activities. These efforts may include, but are not limited to annual giving, major gift development, corporate and foundation relations, and planned gift identification and advancement. The Director of Development Senior 2 has a minimum personal fundraising responsibility of \$1,500,000. This position works collaboratively with the Washington State University Foundation development team in support of college/area and university strategic development goals.

Classification Requirements (Minimum Qualifications)

A Bachelor's degree and seven (7) years of progressively responsible full-time professional fundraising or consultative sales experience within a complex organization, which includes at least three (3) years as a unit director or equivalent leadership experience and demonstrated success in face-to-face solicitations of gifts of \$75,000 or more, OR comparable experience. A Master's degree in a related field may be substituted for up to one (1) year of the required experience.

Consultative sales are defined as the sale of real estate, industrial equipment, vehicles, custom services, or bulk commodities, which include long term relationships between salespeople and clients. Consultative sales positions are typically compensated on a commission basis and have the authority to negotiate the terms and conditions of individual sales with customers.
