



WSU Alternative Route CAMINOS Scholarship



- Are you multilingual?
- Do you work as a paraprofessional in a dual-language school?
- Are you planning to enter college in 2025 or 2027?

If yes, then check this out:

- WSU Tri-Cities has been awarded \$3.1 million over the next five years that will fully support two cohorts of paraprofessionals wanting to earn their BA in K-8 education through [Alternative Route](#).
- The grant, “Certifying and Advancing Multilingual Teachers by Increasing Numbers Through Three Grow-Your-Own Strands” ([CAMINOS](#)), focuses on increasing our area’s multilingual teachers and teachers prepared to work with multilingual learners in such areas as *bilingual education, English language learning, or special education*.

What will I need to qualify for a CAMINOS scholarship?

- Demonstrate proficiency in a language other than English (teaching experience in a bilingual/dual-language classroom; schooling in a non-English-speaking country; schooling in a U.S. dual-language school; AP coursework in two or more languages; GPA of 3.0 or more in two or more languages) – *a competitive priority, but not a must*
