- Are you multilingual?
- Do you want to teach K-12 students who are multilingual?
- Are you planning to enter college in 2025 or 2027?

If yes, then check this out:

- WSU Tri-Cities has been awarded \$3.1 million over the next five years that will fully support two cohorts of prospective educators going through [the Teaching Bridge](#).
- The grant, “Certifying and Advancing Multilingual Teachers by Increasing Numbers Through Three Grow-Your-Own Strands” ([CAMINOS](#)), focuses on increasing our area’s multilingual teachers and teachers prepared to work with multilingual learners in such areas as *bilingual education, English language learning, or special education*.

What will I need to qualify for a CAMINOS scholarship?

While in high school:

- Enroll into Teaching Academy
- Gain [the Seal of Biliteracy](#) and/or [demonstrate dual language proficiency](#) (e.g., World Languages AP, STAMP, ACTFL, World Language Competency Based Credits) – *a competitive priority, but not a must*

Approaching high school graduation:

- [Apply to WSU Tri-Cities](#) for admission for Fall 2025 (or Fall 2027) & apply for admission to [the Teaching Bridge](#) for that term.
