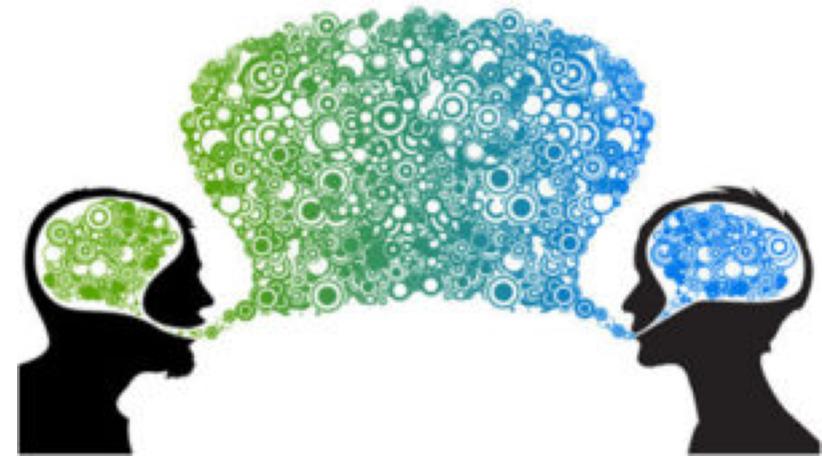
13 Strategic Intervention Briefs
