The National Radiobiology Archives (NRA) is an effort to capture and preserve records and specimens from life-span radiobiology studies conducted in the United States. A cost-effective compromise archival approach was adopted. Formalin fixed tissue samples were discarded while electronic and paper records for >6000 life-span-observation dogs were preserved along with paraffin blocks and histopathology slides for a significant subset. The NRA also includes detailed records of major life-span rodent studies.
