
ADARP Undergraduate Research Fellowship Program for Research on Alcohol and Drug Addiction

Spring 2027: **ORSO Approval Deadline – 5 pm, Thursday, September 3, 2026**

The Alcohol and Drug Addiction Research Program (ADARP) is seeking applications for undergraduate research fellowships. Applicants must have identified a faculty member (Sponsor) and a specific project pertaining to drug addiction research. Applicants must be WSU undergraduate students who will not have graduated before the fellowship start date. Award amounts are as follows:

Funding Period	Stipend	Benefits	Supplies
Spring 2027	\$1,800	\$ 40	\$1,200

Application Procedure: Grants must be written by the student PI with feedback from the Sponsor.

- I. e-REX submitted via e-REX by the home department. *Check with your grants administrator for departmental submission deadline! "ADARP" must be indicated in the e-REX Subagency field for proposal review.*
- II. Cover Sheet (please use attached form)
- III. Please attach a description of your proposed research project (maximum 1,800 words for sections B-G). Include under bold subheadings the following items:
 - A. Title, Name, Date, WSU Number, Abstract
 - B. Specific Aims
 - C. Background Literature (discuss)
 - D. Rationale for the Proposed Research
 - E. Research Design (include groups, doses, sample sizes, measurements, *data analysis*)
 - F. Expected Results
 - G. Discussion of how the results will answer the research question
 - H. Relevance of your project to your faculty sponsor's research
 - I. Relevance of your project to your career goals
 - J. Time commitment: briefly discuss the time commitment required
 - K. Your role in developing this project and writing this proposal
- IV. Have two letters of recommendation sent to **amanda.tanner@wsu.edu** to arrive by the grant deadline.
 - A. A letter of support from your faculty sponsor, explaining as specifically as possible
 - What assistance you will provide for his or her research program
 - What part you played in developing the project and writing the application
 - B. A recommendation from someone else who has knowledge of your laboratory or problem-solving skills, e.g., a teaching assistant, faculty member, or supervisor
